



Four Years of Impact

The Abilene Farmers Market received a Pathways grant to become an incorporated entity and secure the equipment needed to offer healthy foods to SNAP recipients. The Market received a second Pathways grant to join the Double Up Food Bucks program, increasing the availability of fresh produce to financially stressed families.

The City of Abilene adopted a Tobacco Free Parks resolution and received a Pathways grant to construct a walking path around the perimeter of Bi-Centennial Park, increasing safe physical activity options for residents of all ages.

Discovery Childcare Learning Center in Herington, Little Lions Learning Center in Hope and Abilene Childcare Learning Center each adopted a comprehensive tobacco free policy and received Pathways grants to increase physical activity time for the children in their care with the purchase of climbing equipment to allow more outside play. They also obtained signage to educate staff, parents and the public about tobacco cessation and resources.
