



Four Years of Impact

The Hesston Resource Center received a Pathways grant to support their work to provide healthier food based on feedback from the clients. The funds will be used to purchase additional storage and shelving to assist with easier sorting of products into green, yellow and red categories.

The City of Halstead was awarded grant funding to connect a new sidewalk from the Halstead Housing Authority to existing sidewalk. This will provide residents with a safe walking route to downtown shopping and activities and will tie in with the Safe Routes to School for students.

USD 373 Cooper Early Education Center received funding in recognition of updating their policies for screen time and play for pre-K students. They will use the funds to help implement a weekend backpack plan to provide food for the weekend for students who are at risk of going hungry.
