





Four Years of Impact

Throughout the eight years of the Pathways to a Healthy Kansas Initiative, we have found that food insecurity is an issue in our county. In the initial four years, we teamed up with local restaurants, food stores, schools and workplaces, championing healthy choices at every turn. Over the last four years, we also focused on raising awareness through impactful initiatives like the 'On the Table' documentary, highlighting the factors contributing to food insecurity while also working to improve access to nutritious food by supporting the Food Pantry and Farmers Market.

Over the life of the Pathways Initiative, the City and School District of Buhler have undergone remarkable transformations. We assisted the Mustard Seed, Buhler Market and local schools in promoting healthy food options and encouraging physical activity. Subsequently, the construction of a walking trail facilitated increased activity levels among Sunshine Retirement Community residents, while also enhancing access to the market and restaurants.

From Voices to Victories: The Impact of Community Engagement

The Reno County Farmers Market, with assistance from Reno County K-State Research and Extension, gathered feedback from vendors and customers to enhance their experience and market offerings. The feedback highlighted the need for new educational resources and a market ambassador to support SNAP and other opportunities, to be implemented in the 2024 season.
