Credibility Interval	±3% for the entire sample; higher for subgroups



Health care costs are a major concern and significant problem for Kansans.


Cost of Health Care Very Concerning to 7-in-10 Residents.

Q11-16. Costs have been on the rise recently. How much of a problem has each of the following been for your family's finances—has it been a major problem, minor problem, or not a problem at all?






Costs are seen as a much bigger health care issue in Kansas than access or quality.

Q30. Which ONE of the following do you think is the most important health care issue facing Kansas today?






Kansans report big increases in health care costs, especially hospital bills.




Many Kansans report putting off health care due high costs: half have put off hospital care.

Half of Residents Put off Hospital Care because of Cost.





Q32. How often do you put off seeing a doctor or receiving care at a hospital because of the cost?
